# **Highlights of Annual Budget Estimates for 2023-24**

Today on 24<sup>th</sup> February, 2023 Hon'ble Minister, Finance Sri Niranjan Pujari presented a welfare, growth, development and investment-oriented Annual Budget for 2023-24 in the Odisha Legislative Assembly with an outlay of ₹2,30,000 crore, which is about 15% more than the Annual Budget, 2022-23.

Like previous years, this year also the Budget was presented in two parts – **Agriculture Budget** and **General Budget**. The comparative position of the outlays for 2022-23 (BE) and 2023-24 (BE) are as follows:

## 1. Qualitative Aspects of the Budget

- ❖ The outlay of ₹1,25,000 crore for Programme Expenditure. The Programme Budget has increased by thirty-five times from Rs.3,538 crore in 2000-01, over a period of twenty-three years.
- ❖ The proportion of Capital expenditure in Odisha to total budget is highest among all major States in the country. The capital outlay in 2022-23 is ₹51,683 crore, which is about 6 per cent of GSDP. The capital outlay has gone up by more than sixty times from Rs.834 crore during 2000-01.
- ❖ The allocation of ₹24,829 crore for Agriculture and Allied sector, an increase of 21% over previous year.
- ❖ Allocation of ₹30,030 crore for Education and Skills sector.
- ❖ Allocation of ₹16,048 crore for Health sector, an increase of 27% over previous year.
- ❖ Investment of more than **Rs.13,215 crore** during the year 2023-24 for **piped drinking water in rural areas** from budget and off-budget sources.
- ❖ Allocation of ₹38,437 crore for development of SCs and STs for identified Schemes in the Programme budget.

- ❖ Investment of **Rs.19,452 crore** under Roads, Bridges, Airports and Railways which is 34 percent higher than last year's provision.
- ❖ Own Revenue -GSDP Ratio for 2023-24 (BE) is 12.25%.

- **Revenue Surplus** projected at 3.1% of GSDP.
- ❖ Fiscal Deficit kept within the prescribed limit of 3% of GSDP.
