Sub:- Special arrangement for faster clearing of Cheques/ Drafts received towards State Government revenue on 31st March, 2023.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to enclose copies of D.O. Letter No CO.DGBA.GBD. No. S1490/42-01-029/2022-2023 dated 21st March, 2023 of the Chief General Manager, Department of Government & Bank Accounts (DGBA), Reserve Bank of India, Mumbai on "Annual Closing of Government Accounts – Transactions of Central/ State Governments – Special Measures for the Current Financial Year (2022-23)" and D.O. Letter No. CO.DPSS.RPPD.No./S2185/03-01-002/2022-23 dated 29th March, 2023 of Chief General Manager, Department of Payment and Settlement Systems (DPSS), Central Office, RBI, Mumbai on "Special Clearing operations on March 31, 2023" and to say that in order to facilitate receipt of taxes and revenue following instructions have been issued to the Chairman & Managing Director/ Chief Executive Officers of all Agency Banks: -

- All agency banks should keep their designated branches open for over the counter transaction related to Government transactions up to normal working hours on 31st March, 2023.
- Transactions through National Electronic Funds Transfer (NEFT) and Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) system will continue up to 2400 hours as hitherto on 31st March, 2023.
- 2. With a view to facilitate accounting of all Government transactions for the current financial year (2022-23) by 31st March, 2023, it has been decided to conduct Special Clearing exclusively for Government Cheques on 31st March, 2023.
- 3. It is mandatory for all banks to participate in the special clearing operations on March 31, 2023. All member banks are required to keep their inward clearing processing infrastructure open during the Special Clearing hours and maintain sufficient balance in their clearing settlement account to meet settlement obligations arising out of the Special Clearing.
- 4. Further, the member banks of Clearing House have been advised to adhere to the instructions issued by Reserve Bank of India as well as instructions issued by the Presidents of the respective CTS Grids.
- 5. Accordingly, subordinate Officers in charge of collection of revenue may kindly be instructed to take necessary steps for expeditious clearance of instruments received towards Government dues on 31st March, 2023.

Annual Closing of Government Accounts – Transactions of Central / State Governments – Special Measures for the Current Financial Year (2022-23)

All government transactions done by agency banks for the Financial Year 2022-23 must be accounted for within the same financial year. Accordingly, the following arrangements are put in place to report and account for Government transactions for March 31, 2023.

- All agency banks should keep their designated branches open for over the counter transactions related to government transactions upto the normal working hours on March 31, 2023.
- Transactions through National Electronic Funds Transfer (NEFT) and Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) System will continue upto 2400 hours as hitherto on March 31, 2023.
- 4. Special clearing will be conducted for collection of government cheques on March 31, 2023 for which the Department of Payment and Settlement Systems (DPSS), RBI will issue necessary instructions.
- Regarding reporting of Central and State Government transactions to RBI, including uploading of GST/ TIN2.0/ e-receipts luggage files, the reporting window of March 31, 2023 will be kept open till 1200 hours noon on April 1, 2023.
- Agency banks may take note and give adequate publicity to the special arrangements made as above.

Special Clearing Operations on March 31, 2023

A reference is invited to the circular issued by Department of Government and Bank Accounts (DGBA) vide CO.DGBA.GBD.No.S1490/42-01-029/2022-2023 dated March 21, 2023 addressed to all the agency banks on Annual Closing of Government Accounts —Transactions of Central/State Governments — Special Measures for the Current Financial Year (2022-23).

2. Normal clearing timings as applicable to any working "Friday" shall be followed on March 31, 2023. Further, to facilitate accounting of all the Government transactions for the current financial year (2022-23) by March 31, 2023, it has been decided to conduct Special Clearing exclusively for Government Cheques across the three CTS grids on March 31, 2023 as detailed below:

Location	Presentation Clearing	Return Clearing
CTS Grids (New Delhi,	Between 17:00 and 17:30	Between 19:00 and 19:30
Chennai and Mumbai)	Hours	Hours

3. It is mandatory for all banks to participate in the special clearing operations on March 31, 2023. All the member banks under the respective CTS Grids are required to keep their inward clearing processing infrastructure open during the Special Clearing hours and maintain sufficient balance in their clearing settlement account to meet settlement obligations arising out of the Special Clearing.

4. Member banks under the respective CTS Grids are advised to adhere to the instructions contained in this circular as well as instructions issued by the President of the respective CTS grids. Member banks may also be guided by the circular NPCI/2016-17/CTS/Circular No.32 dated October 3, 2016 issued by NPCI to all member banks regarding clearing type for instruments to be presented in Special Clearing sessions.
