Subject—Grant of House Rent Allowance to the Government employees deputed to the Corporations and Companies, etc.

Payment of house rent and drawal of House Rent Allowance by the employees of the various Corporation and Undertaking including the State Government employees deputed to the said Corporations and Undertakings are regulated as per the principles laid down in Finance Department Memo. No. 27670-F., dated the 21st August 1963. According to these principle an employee is liable to pay rent @ $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ or 5% of his emoluments as the case may be and is entitled to house rent allowance from the Corporation/Company equal to the difference between the actual rent paid and the rent he is liable to pay from his own resources and that the house rent allowance so payable by the Corporation/Company shall not exceed 10% of his emoluments. The intention behind the aforesaid Memo. was to regulate payment of house rent rate in respect of both the employees of the Corporations/allowance and drawal of house rent allowance at a uniform Companies as well as Government servants deputed to serve to such Corporations/Undertakings on foreign service terms and conditions.

2. It has come to the notice of the Government that the principles laid down in the aforesaid Finance Department Memo. are not being uniformly followed by the Corporations/Companies in respect of thier own employees as well as the Government employees working on deputation. In some Corporations house rent allowance has been

given to their own employees at higher rate while the Government servants who are working under them on deputation have been paid house rent allowance strictly according to the instructions issued in the aforesaid Finance Department Memorandum. This has created avoidable discontent.

3. With a view to remove disparity Government after careful consideration have been pleased to decide that payment of house rent allowance to the Government employees deputed to the Corporations/Undertakings on foreign service terms should hereafter be regulated according to the rules of the respective Corporations/Undertakings. Instructions issued in Finance Department Memo. No. 27670(96)-F., dated the 21st August 1963 and No. 49095(155) F., dated the 3rd November 1982 will stand modified to the above extent and the terms and conditions of the deputation of Government servants now on deputation would accordingly stand revised.

Subject—Grant of House Rent Allowance to the Government employees deputed to the Corporations and Companies, etc.

In the Finance Department Office Memorandum No. 6722-F., dated the 15th February 1984 it has been provided that Government servants deputed to the Corporations/Undertakings of foreign service terms would be eligible to draw house rent allowance at the rates prescribed by the respective Corporations/Undertakings for their own employees. The above provision was made with a view to remove the disparity in the rates of house rent allowance admissible to the own employees of a Corporation and to the Government servants on deputation to the said Corporation. The house rent allowance is admissible to a Government servant
