**NOTIFICATION**

Bhubaneswar, the 11th August 1988

No. 30584—C.C.A.-46/87-F.—Rule 7 (3) of the Orissa Auditors Service (Method of Recruitment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 1987 provides that in order to become eligible for promotion to the post of Audit Superintendent an Auditor under the Common Cadre must have passed the departmental examination as specified in the Schedule II of the said Rules. While drawing up the select list of Auditors for promotion to the grade of Auditor Superintendent with a view to filling up a number of vacant posts in such grade in different Departments, the Selection Board looked into this condition of eligibility of the Auditors for promotion and observed that since the above Rules came into force only after the 31st March 1988, prior to which there was no statutory obligation on the part of an Auditor to pass any departmental examination, it would not be administratively fair and expedient to debar the Auditors having long years of service from promotion without their prior knowledge of such a requirement. The Selection Board, therefore, was of the view that it would be expedient to exempt the Auditors who have completed 8 (eight) years of service as on the 1st January 1988 from passing the required departmental examination.

2. After careful consideration of the above recommendation of the Selection Board and in exercise of the powers conferred under Rule-18 of the Orissa Auditors Service (Method of Recruitment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 1987, Government have been pleased to decide that the Auditors under the Common Cadre, controlled by Finance Department, who have completed 8 years of service as Auditor as on the 1st January 1988 shall be exempted from passing the departmental examination as specified in Schedule II of the above said Rules.

3. The above order will take immediate effect.

Subject—Supply of leather shoes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite a reference to Finance Department G. O. No. 24692, dated the 21st May 1981 in which monetary limit for supply of shoes to the Zamadars and Orderlies of the Chief Minister, Ministers, Deputy Ministers, Ministers of State, Chief Secretary and Additional Chief Secretary at an interval of one and half years in the monetary limit of Rs. 50 per pair last fixed.

Due to rise in the cost of leather goods it has now been decided to raise the above monetary limit to Rs. 62 (Rupees sixty-two) only per pair exclusive of all taxes. Conditions regarding periodicity of supply shall remain unchanged.

This order shall take effect from the date of issue.
