Bhubaneswar, the 8th September 1988

Subject— Monetary limit for supply of hot weather liveries to the Class-IV staff attached to the Ministers/Chief Secretary/Additional Chief Secretary/Chairman of O. P. S. C. and Zamadars to Secretaries and Additional Secretaries/Heads of Departments.

In Finance Department O. M. No. 39315, dated the 20th September 1984 the monetary limit for supply of hot weather

liveries to Class-IV staff attached to the Ministers/Chief Secretary/Additional Chief Secretary /Chairman, Orissa Public Service Commission and Zamadars to Secretaries and Additional Secretaries/Heads of Departments was fixed at Rs. 300 per employee at an interval of 1½ years. Subsequently, the State Government decided that only Poly Bastra fabrics shall be used for liveries of the Class-IV employees of all the State Government Offices/Public Sector Undertakings etc. In view of the above decision, it was felt necessary to review the monetary limit fixed for the purpose.

After careful consideration, Government have been pleased to decide that monetary limit for supply of hot weather liveries made of Poly Bastra fabrics to the above categories of Class-IV staff, including stitching charges, shall be Rs. 500 per employee per set consisting of the following:—

The liveries shall be supplied once in every two years.

Every fresh supply shall be made on production of old sets.

Only Poly-Bastra fabrics shall be used for liveries. The Administrative Department should ensure that the cloths required for the liveries should be purchased during 'Dasahara' by availing 50 per cent rebate allowed by the Handloom Development Corporation.

This order shall come into force with effect from the date of issue.

Further, the Administrative authorities should ensure that liveries supplied are put on regularly by the employees concerned while on duty.
