

2. In order to extend the aforesaid additional leave benefits to those categories of Government servants, Government have been pleased to decide in modification of Para. (4) of F. D. O. M., dated the 25th March 1991 that the above categories of Government servants will be entitled to 15 days additional E. L. and surrender of 30 days E. L. each year, as in F. D. O. M., dated the 4th September 1995 in addition to their receipt of special pay.

3. This order shall be effective from the date of its issue.

4. The cases already decided in terms of F.D. O. M., dated the 25th March 1991 shall not be reopened.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT—Surrender of Earned Leave in lieu of Leave Salary and Allowances—Clarification regarding.

In terms of Para 3 (a) (vi) of Finance Department Office Memorandum No. 21666-F., dated the 14th June 1994, an applicant, in absence of his Service Book/Roll with the sanctioning authority, is required to prove and convince the sanctioning authority that he is having required extent of Earned Leave at his credit on the day of sanction. Despite the above provision, it has come to the notice of Government that the benefit of the 11th Block period (1-4-1994—31-3-1996) could not be sanctioned/drawn during the block period where the Government servant had applied at the fag end of the block period/where the sanction order of the higher authority had reached the subordinate office after expiry of the block period/where the Government servant either on leave or tour had failed to convince his authority about his leave account/where the service book/Roll was held up with the higher authority.

2. In consideration of the above facts, Government in modification of Para 3 (a) (vi) of Finance Department Office Memorandum No. 21666-F., date the 14th June 1994 have been pleased to decide that the relaxation contained in Finance Department Resolution No. 48196/F., dated the 7th December 1984 (Para. 2) and in Office Memorandum No. 44161/F., dated the 30th November 1988 (Para. 2) shall be applicable in the cases where the benefit of surrender leave could not be granted within the block period due to grounds mentioned above.

3. This order shall take effect from the block period i. e., 1-4-1994 - 31-3-1996
